## **Review of Minutes**

Watershed Committee Update—Mr. Kromrey recognized Paul Obermann with Commercial Metals Company for becoming a WCO Sustaining Sponsor and Bronze Sponsor of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event and Bass Pro Shops for donating Discover Packs that will be used on educational field trips at the Watershed Center. Mr. Kromey said WCO received a Little Sac Restoration and Improvement 319 Grant, \$480K, 60% and 40% match that will include riparian restoration, prescribed grazing and stream restoration.

Riparian Restoration and Protection: 4 Years of Implementation—Joe Pitts, Director, James River Basin Partnership and Terry Whaley, Director, Ozark Greenways—Mr. Pitts stated the Riparian Corridor and Restoration Project was made possible by a grant received by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources in 2009, \$1M in total value. The targeted protection area was 10 miles of riparian corridor and donated easements for perpetuity. Completed projects include River Bluff Farm in Stone County, approximately 5 linear miles and Wilson's Creek above the Wastewater Treatment Plant in Greene County, approximately 2 linear miles. River Cut Golf Course and Kreider Park in Greene County is nearly complete, approximately 2 linear miles and pending is South Creek, near Darr Agricultural Center, approximately 2 linear miles of stream naturalization, reforestation and fence adjustments.

**Natural Resources Conservation Service Update** — Michael Squires — Mr. Squires gave an update of the 2014 Farm Bill.

**Regional Issues**—Barbara Lucks said April was packed full of Earth Day events. Tammy Trantham said she has left Table Rock Lake Water Quality.
